Behind closed doors, they ghostwrite "model" bills to be introduced in state capitols across the country. Although many of these bills have become law, until now, their origin has been largely unknown. Model Resolution

WHEREAS, the growth in federal spending of the Medicaid and welfare entitlements are 2011? astronomical and spiraling, significantly increasing the federal budget costs, and

WHEREAS, this growth will never be controlled unless the states have autonomous management of the programs, free from Federal mandates regarding individual entitlement, eligibility groups, benefits, payment rates, and financing structures to allow most citizens of the states to benefit from the Medicaid and welfare programs, and

WHEREAS, the states will be able to design and develop innovative, efficient and productive Medicaid and welfare programs that will meet the needs of the residents within the state of [insert States]'s budget capacity, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the legislature of the state of [insert State] urges Congress to pass federal funds on to States via block grants to be used for public welfare and Medicaid purposes, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution will be distributed to all Governors and members of the U.S. Senate and the U.S. House of Representatives.

Center for Media and Democracy's quick summary

This Resolution calls on Congress to amend Medicaid to replace the current funding program (a federal matching percentage of state costs) with block grants. It also calls for block grants for welfare, a change that happened in part with 1996 federal welfare reforms.

ALEC passed a similar Resolution in 2008 calling for block grants for Medicaid, but not mentioning welfare (the "Resolution on Medicaid Funding Through a Federal Block Grant). In 2011, Rep. Paul Ryan(R-WI) proposed a similar block grant system for Medicaid in his budget proposal.
